Brethren,

These words struck me recently as I realized that, as Freemasons, we are always working on building our own cathedral; we just don't always recognize it. As children, we are unskilled laborers digging the foundations for that future edifice—frequently apathetically, sometimes grudgingly, but rarely enthusiastically—guided by the direct instruction of the adults around us. At this age, we have little to no appreciation for the vision that our Overseers of the Work have for us and our future cathedral.

As we progress through adolescence and into manhood, we are no longer digging the foundations but are now cutting and laying the stones, but in what guise? Most of us likely are like the first two laborers in the quote above—doing the work because it's expected of us or we're biding our time until something better comes along.

At some point, however, each of us who eventually knocked at the door had a sudden insight that caused us change our perspective. Perhaps we caught sight of the beautiful cathedral that another builder was constructing, and wished to emulate it; perhaps we learned that some of the greats of the past shared a common bond of this "cathedral building" and were curious to discover more about it; or perhaps some of us were inspired when, upon asking someone what it is they were doing, they replied "I'm building a cathedral."

As Most Worshipful Ken Clay reminded us last month, we all came into the Craft for different reasons and via different paths, but the common bond that keeps us together is that desire to be with and emulate the Brethren around us—whether it be the work that they do or the cathedral that they are building for themselves.
